#### LIGHTING OF THE ADVENT CANDLES

Reader: When the angel Gabriel visited Mary, she sings to Elizabeth:

My soul glorifies the Lord and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior, for he has been mindful of the humble state of his servant. From now on all generations will call me blessed, for the Mighty One has done great things for me—holy is his name.

We, like Mary, hear God's call to be part of making God's dream for our salvation and flourishing a reality. We question, "How can this be? I am only..." Yet, like Mary, God's love can transform us into bearers of good news.

Unison: We light these candles as signs of our shocking hope, our just peace, our fierce joy, and the love that transforms us. May Love grow within us, transforming us into bold witnesses of God's salvation with our voices and our lives.

Light the four outer candles of the Advent wreath.

Reader: Tonight, we come seeking hope, peace, joy, and love, and we find these things in a child that God made flesh as a baby in a manger. A baby who is both the beginning and the end of our salvation, who dwells with us even now, our Emmanuel, God with us.

Unison: We light these candles as signs of our shocking hope, our just peace, our fierce joy, the love that transforms us, and Jesus Christ, our wondrous Light. May the Light burning in our hearts guide us, comfort us, protect us, and tend us in all seasons and circumstances. May we be reminded that, day and night, in the light and in the darkness, God is with us. Amen.
