# Finance Committee

For the Finance Committee, **June 30**th **is the end of our Fiscal Year, so please submit any expense reimbursement requests no later than June 15**th to the Treasurer's mailbox in the church office. Alternately, you may email your request with a photo of receipts to <a href="mailto:rangeleyuccfinance@gmail.com">rangeleyuccfinance@gmail.com</a>. Please include your full name and address in addition to relevant details and expense account numbers.

The Finance Committee meets via Zoom monthly to review and discuss the financial activity and reports of the church. Our most recent meeting was on May 16<sup>th</sup> at 3:45pm. In addition to our normal monthly reviews, we discussed concerns about the proposed budget and the projected deficit. This arose not only out of our own committee's concerns but from several members of the congregation reaching out to Finance and Council members.

Our current year's performance has again been affected by COVID closures for much of the year. This closure caused our fuel and utilities expenses to be less than budgeted for much of the year. We have experienced generous giving by those who have overpaid their pledged amounts by \$4,120. The number of families who pledge contributions has decreased over the past five years from 43 to 28. Our income from contributions has been decreasing overall in recent years as members have moved away or left the congregation. We still have \$8,460 in unpaid pledges that may be contributed before 6/30/22. Because of this, it is difficult to predict exactly where we will end the year financially. Projections range from a \$2,000 deficit to a \$9,500 deficit depending on expenses and contributions for the next two months.

The 2022-2023 proposed budget is based on the requested changes from church boards and is guided by historical data and anticipated changes to expenses and income. The proposed budget, at the time of the meeting on May 16<sup>th,</sup> included extraordinary increases in oil, propane, electricity, groundskeeping, and COLA salary adjustments in addition to more typical increases in most of the other expense categories. The recent economic situation which has seen unprecedented inflation has also reduced the value of the church's investments.

As a result of the discussion during the May 16<sup>th</sup> meeting, the Finance Committee requested that the Council review the budget again. This was done on May 22<sup>nd.</sup> As a result of the Council

meeting, the budget was reduced by just over \$7,000 to a projected deficit of just over \$26,000. These savings were made by eliminating church cleaning by an outside service and removing COLA adjustments to salaries. There will be more discussion about the budget, the deficit and our church's financial long-term outlook at the Annual Meeting on July 10<sup>th</sup>, immediately following our service. The budget that is presented in the Annual Report is always a "Proposed Budget" and is subject to review, discussion, amendments and a final vote at our Annual Meeting. Annual reports will be emailed to all members by late June. Please review the financial information before the Annual Meeting.

Members of the Finance Committee will be available to answer any questions regarding the proposed budget following the service on Sunday, June 26<sup>th</sup>. Please take advantage of this opportunity if you have questions or concerns.

Our next Finance Committee meeting will be on June 13<sup>h</sup> at 3:45pm via Zoom unless otherwise decided by the committee. As always, your input and participation are welcomed at our monthly meetings. Please contact Paula Hatfield if you would like to be included in the meeting.
