Your Church Sustainability Team wants to thank all of you who completed our first questionnaire and participated in our initial group discussion on January 29th regarding the questionnaire results. We had 21 folks present and 7 zoomed in for this meeting. Like many other churches we are facing decreased membership and income. Please reference the budget summary page and pie chart from our 2022 Annual Report where it shows our budgeted income of \$88,510.00 seen at the top left of the page and the budgeted expenses for 2022/23 of \$114,839.00 resulting in a projected shortfall of -\$26,329.00 for our current fiscal year. The prior budget year's expenses were \$111,371.00 and our budget shortfall was projected at -\$24,865.00, this shortfall ended up reduced with savings from not holding in-person services and continuing to zoom saving on heating, maintenance, etc.. The Sustainability Team is looking forward to working with you all on solutions for immediate budget concerns as well as looking and mid and long-range goals. If anyone has feedback, questions, suggestions please reach out to any one of the Team memberswe're all in this together as we pull together to find the future as God is calling us.

Our next meeting will be on February 12th after worship in the Barn, we keep meetings to an hour/hour and half at the most.




2022-2023 Fiscal Year Proposed Budget - Expenses by Category
